COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Prerequisite: None, Open to all grades 9-12

This is a fundamentals course designed to reinforce and build on prior knowledge and skills. This course offers an introduction to elements and principles of art, media, color theory, art concepts, techniques, and history of art. It provides experiences in design, drawing, painting, ceramics, printmaking, and art appreciation. *This course is a prerequisite for all Honors and AP Studio courses.*

LATE ASSIGNMENTS:

- Explorations and Classwork: All Classwork, Critiques, Sketchbook assignments and Warm-ups have specified due dates. All work submitted after the due date will accrue a 10-point deduction each week these assignments are late. Work will be accepted until end of each quarter, however any assignment not turned in before the end of quarter deadlines will stay a zero.

RULES AND PROCEDURES IN VISUAL ARTS CLASSROOM

- 1. DO NOT BE LATE FOR CLASS! See Northwest Tardy Policy
- 2. **BE RESPECTFUL** to yourself, your teacher, administrators, other students, visitors, and materials.
- 3. Bring all required materials to class each day. Do not come to class unprepared.
- 4. Art class is **not a social time** for visiting friends. Art class is for improving your creativity and ability; if you do not complete and submit work, you will not receive a passing grade. No extra credit will be given.
- 5. All assignments must include your first and last name, date and class period. No name, no grade!
- 6. Keep your art in a safe place (class/portfolios or home) for the art show in April and competitions.
- 7. You are not allowed do work from other classes in art class. If you are caught doing work from another class, it will be taken from you and may **NOT** be returned to you. Likewise, do not work on art in other classes.
- 8. **Every student must contribute to the clean-up process**. Class will be held after the bell for not cleaning your area or materials.
- 9. If students need additional studio time, they can make arrangements with their teacher. Time will be available during WIN period.
- 10. Cell Phones may NOT BE USED DURING INSTRUCTION. During active artwork creating time in class cell phones may be allowed for music (with headphones only) and to use as research for projects. Phones may NOT be used to watch videos, take pictures, talk on the phone, play games, etc. unless otherwise instructed by the teacher. If you are missing more than 2 class assignments, you may lose in-class phone privileges! A verbal WARNING is given for first infraction and your cell phone will be confiscated with further infractions. See school cell phone policy
- 11. Bathroom Policy. No use of the restroom during the first and last 10 minutes of class, use the restroom during class change.
- **12.** Hall Passes. Northwest enforces the use of hall passes. If you are leaving the classroom, you must have a hall pass with you designating your destination. (You are never allowed to go to your car throughout the school day.)
